

Due to the precipitous decline of the U.S. dollar in recent months, I feel I need to re-price the *Energumen* disk. I used to give Canadian customers a break by selling it in Canadian dollars at par with American, but that was when the Buck was worth \$1.30 Canadian. (And the year before that it was \$1.42 to the Loonie.) Now that the Buck is worth 91 cents, I'm losing nearly 40 cents on the dollar not just on Canadian sales, but all sales. Effective with the first of January 2008, I'm going to be asking \$20, S&H included, in either U.S. or Canadian dollars. (UK or Aussie sales add \$2 for the extra S&H.) Hopefully that will remain effective, but if the U.S. \$ sinks below .85 Canadian, there may have to be yet another price hike, for U.S. customers at least.

(So far sales have skyrocketed to 12 after the recent Ditto. Murray Moore sold a grand total of four at the con. I think this averages out to about 1 and a half a month.)

CONVENTION ORGANIZATION, ESP. NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION IN THE U.S.

Apparently the American Bar Association is working on a revision to the revised model that most states have adopted in one form or another. The last revision was in 1986 and things have changed and parts of the model act haven't done what was expected. ENRON and events of September 11th have also taken place since the last model was published. It's likely the ABA will be unveiling a new act sometime soon. Soon in this case is a relative term, though the Secretary of State of Washington was talking about some of the expected changes to non-profit groups in 2006, one can expect changes to Washington states non-profit laws sometime after the revisions are put out by the ABA, again relative is the key phrase, but if several states quickly adopt the revisions in part or in whole quickly, then more likely than not the Washington, Oregon, and Idaho legislatures will act to change current law to conform in part or in whole to the proposed revised model act. In any case the pump of change is likely to be primed in the relatively near future.

CONTRARY VIEWS

ONE of the world's foremost meteorologists has called the theory that helped Al Gore share the Nobel Peace Prize "ridiculous" and the product of "people who don't understand how the atmosphere works".

Dr William Gray, a pioneer in the science of seasonal hurricane forecasts, told a packed lecture hall at the University of North Carolina that humans were not responsible for the warming of the earth.

His comments came on the same day that the Nobel committee honoured Mr Gore for his work in support of the link between humans and global warming.

"We're brainwashing our children," said Dr Gray, 78, a long-time professor at Colorado State University. "They're going to the Gore movie [*An Inconvenient Truth*] and being fed all this. It's ridiculous."

At his first appearance since the award was announced in Oslo, Mr Gore said: "We have to quickly find a way to change the world's consciousness about exactly what we're facing."

Mr Gore shared the Nobel prize with the United Nations climate panel for their work in helping to galvanise international action against global warming.

But Dr Gray, whose annual forecasts of the number of tropical storms and hurricanes are widely publicised, said a natural cycle of ocean water temperatures - related to the amount of salt in ocean water - was responsible for the global warming that he acknowledges has taken place.

However, he said, that same cycle meant a period of cooling would begin soon and last for several years.

"We'll look back on all of this in 10 or 15 years and realise how foolish it was," Dr Gray said.

During his speech to a crowd of about 300 that included meteorology students and a host of professional meteorologists, Dr Gray also said those who had linked global warming to the increased number of hurricanes in recent years were in error.

He cited statistics showing there were 101 hurricanes from 1900 to 1949, in a period of cooler global temperatures, compared to 83 from 1957 to 2006 when the earth warmed.

"The human impact on the atmosphere is simply too small to have a major effect on global temperatures," Dr Gray said.

He said his beliefs had made him an outsider in popular science.

"It bothers me that my fellow scientists are not speaking out against something they know is wrong," he said. "But they also

THE CHESTER SF COLLECTION

Chester Cuthbert, a longtime SF fan and SF collector in Winnipeg, donated his collection to a library this fall. On the 10th of October some members of the SF Northwest email list posted links to the Winnipeg Sun article, dated October 5th. By the time I got to it, though, I couldn't access the article without using my credit card online. (I don't do that.) The destination of the Chester collection remains a mystery.

(Background: In the 1950s there was an attempt to create a federated Canada-wide SF organization; Chester Cuthbert and his original collection were the only remnant of the Winnipeg branch, when a new group of fanzine publishers appeared in the 1970s, and Chester consented to let them use the name. The fans who started the convention Keycon were a separate group.)

Linda Ross-Mansfield (now chair of the World Horror Convention scheduled for 2009 in Winnipeg) commented at one point:

Just in case people weren't certain, if there is enough money raised in time, the next CUFF winner would go to Keycon in 2008. After that, presuming there will be no objections to their request, Anticipation in 2009, would be the next Convention after that. Hopefully there will be some good competition on these. ...

The whole concept of CUFF, or for that matter any fan fund, is to get fans involved with their own community and in contact with others so that they bring back new ideas and contacts to enrich the fan activity in their area, and hopefully with the exchange of concepts and ideas it benefits fan communities. Whereas a pro or semi pro has other funding possibilities available to them not the least of which are Canada Council Grants, and they get invited to be guests at conventions much more regularly. There is no such funding available to fans, because it is 'just a hobby' and therefore the Fan funds were created. Initially they were drawing from fanzine creators and contributors.

Paradoxically, the only element of fandom that might interest them beyond their social horizon is science fiction itself. If you can't get a fan in Halifax interested in fannish doings in Toronto or Edmonton, he or she will probably have an interest in, say, a change of editors at Analog, or who won the Hugo for Best Novel. In other words, the problem is the 98% of SF fans are actually SF fans! Not fans of fandom. I suspect there are maybe only two dozen of those in the country.
