THE CUTHBERT COLLECTION

A while ago I reported part of a story about Chester Cuthbert and his SF collection. Mr. Cuthbert, as you may not know, has been a fixture of Winnipeg fandom since the 1950s, largely by getting a club's library dumped on him when it dissolved. And then it grew. And it grew. It engulfed his house. It threatened to engulf his life. Decadent Winnipeg fandom appeared in the 1970s, barely in time to save him from creating Canada's first uncontrolled black hole.

Dale Speirs writes:

"In Winnipeg, Chester Cuthbert's house full of SF and fantasy books has been donated to the University of Alberta ibrary. U of A librarian Randy Reichardt, an SF fan, arranged the transfer at the end of 2007. Chester turned 95 on 2007-10-15, so it is a relief that the collection will find a place where it is wanted.

"This makes Alberta one of the top places for SF collections. Several years ago the University of Calgary Library received the Bob Gibson collection, an equally massive library of SF."
